

Case Management

Helping connect children and families to resources in the community. Services include but are not limited to needs assessments, planning, coordination, monitoring, and evaluation of your child and family's needs. Case management is available for families currently in services.

- Referrals to food pantries and clothing, school supplies, and/or diaper banks
- Coordinating care between schools, medical providers, and community organizations
- Advocating for family needs to facilitate access to service providers and resources, including schools, childcare, extracurricular activities, and summer camps

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Social Work Services

Assessments

- Conduct Needs Assessments to evaluate and identify family needs. The information obtained from the assessment will help identify resources, supports, and services.
- Conduct diagnostic evaluations for Autism Spectrum Disorder.
- **Assess/Evaluate** – Continuously gather information to help families identify their goals, strengths, and challenges to inform the decision-making process.
- **Plan** – Collaborate with families and multidisciplinary team members to develop individualized plans to meet meaningful goals and obtain necessary services.
- **Implementation** – Assist in coordinating and referring families to resources, support, and services with organizations and their providers.
- **Monitor** – Assess on an ongoing basis whether the services and support are being delivered, whether they are adequate to meet the needs/wants of the child, and make changes as needed.

Individual and Family Counseling

- ASD with comorbidities such as anxiety and ADHD.
- Relationship building between children and parents
- Relationship building between siblings
- Supporting co-parenting

Social Skills Groups

Social Skills Groups are available for children ages 3-17 to promote positive peer interactions and teach age-appropriate social and coping skills.

Direct ABA Therapy

Social Workers use ABA Therapy to implement children's treatment plans in collaboration with ABA team. This may include Direct 1:1 and/or Supervision.

Parent Training

- Parent/Caregiver groups to provide information and connections to community resources.
- Individual Parent/Caregiver training is available to help parents/caregivers feel more confident in managing mental health concerns, managing challenging behaviors, promoting positive behaviors, helping their child with emotion regulation, and supporting the specific needs of their child.
